IFED World Challenge 2023

Rules of the Game:

Admission Criteria

- The World Challenge is reserved for young 'under 40' dentists with interest in esthetic dentistry
- 2. The Academy where the participant belongs should be part of IFED
- 3. The Academy interested in participating will select three participants two active and a reserve.
- 4. Deadline to enroll will be 30/06/2023
- 5. The 'games' will begin in September 2023 and the calendar will be published in August depending on the number of teams running.
- 6. The participants will be named as 'players'

Rules of the Game

- 1. Every match will last 30 minutes with two matches every night (qualification round. 15 minutes of presentation for each player plus 15 minutes of discussion with voting.
- 2. Every team (Country) will have two players
- 3. Cases presented could be the treatment of a single tooth, a quadrant or a full mouth. Clearly complexity of the case will gather more points.
- 4. The format of presentation will have to be 16:9 to best fit Zoom screen
- 5. There will be no limitation to the number of slides for each presentation for as long as they will fit in the given time. Don't forget that time will earn bonus/malus points
- 6. The order of presentations will be drawn the day of the challenge
- 7. There will be three judges 'Master Clinicians' (a prosthodontist, a surgeon and a restorative dentist) of neutral countries managing the games
- 8. In case of tie, the tie-breaker will be the score of the single players, and in case of further tie the three judges will vote again.

Rounds and scores

- 1. The presentations will last 15 minutes
- 2. Following the two presentations the three judges will vote
- 3. Evaluating criteria: judges will vote according to:

- a. Complexity of the case
- b. Quality of documentation
- c. Rationale and treatment plan
- d. Style of presentation

These four categories will give a maximum score of 60 points Judges can score from 0 (scarce) to 5 (excellent) in all four categories. (20 points for each judge)

Bonus Malus: Time will be a factor as if candidate will finish within the assigned time will score + 10 points but also – 10 if will not finish within 15 minutes.

Maximum score will be 70 points (60 from judges + 10 bonus)

Winning teams will advance to the next round.

Within 2023 four 'finalists' will be selected and will play the final four in 2024.

The winner of the final four will challenge Italy at the IFED International Congress in Istanbul. In the final there will be a winner elected by the jury and a winner based on the votes of the public participating.

Organisation

A Challenge Committee will be implemented consisting out of one head (Roberto Rossi/IAED) and 4 further members (2 coming from IFED and 2 coming from the IAED).

Administrative and technical organisation will be done by the IFED office.

Prizes

The two winners will receive the David Klaff IFED award

Receive a prize from one of the sponsor companies

Invited to lecture to the next IFED congress in 2026
